TEAM CARE

So that everyone can fully participate and have a great time, we want to make it easier for everyone to take collective, self-managed responsibility for their own care.

To achieve this, we have a Care Team, identifiable by their fluorescent pink waistcoats and available 24 hours a day.

Its central office, open 24 hours a day, is called the Care-Ort and is located next to the CCL (see map). It has a listening room, an infokiosk and a safer space.

This is also where you can

- register to sleep in a place reserved for people with special needs
- register if you need us to implement our health concept (see below)
- request information related to specific needs
- express your need for intervention, support, listening, debriefing, etc.
- offer to support us by volunteering for a few hours

The Care Team's role is to prevent, identify and manage situations of discomfort, conflict, harassment or discrimination, whether sexist, transphobic, racist, exoticist, ableist, grossophobic, classist or any other acts that reproduce systemic discrimination.

We are aware that, as people socialised in a violent culture, we are likely to reproduce this violence. Nevertheless, we want to move together resolutely towards truly inclusive, anti-capitalist ways of life and relationships emancipated from systemic oppression and discrimination.

Team care is no cop, judge, social worker or psychologist.

Nonetheless, any behaviour that contravenes our charter will be dealt with the aim of putting an end to it, by encouraging discussion and reflection where possible and, if impossible, by resorting to exclusion.

Care is a political issue that affects us all, and we're counting on you to get involved and make these meetings a collective utopia.

We advise you to discuss the subject of mutual care with the friends you meet: affinity groups aren't just for demonstrations!

Drink and use drugs responsibly.

Respect your limits and those of others, be open to criticism and ready to question yourself. Don't forget that there are people among us who are immunocompromised, so think about wearing a mask inside.

Health concept: immunocompromised people or vulnerable to infection

We want to show solidarity with people who are immunocompromised/vulnerable to infection. The rooms will be ventilated, there will be soap, disinfectant, surgical masks in all the buildings and awareness posters will be displayed. People who are immunocompromised/vulnerable to infection are invited to contact the team care during the event if they need any special measures. For example, the team can make an announcement at the beginning of the workshops in which the people in question want to take part to ask participants to show their solidarity and to wear a mask during the workshop.
